

MIDDLE SCHOOL CAMPUS

We are excited to share the incredible journey of one of our young people, Kasey, who bowled at the Junior Tenpin Bowling Nationals in Melbourne.

This event was a whirlwind of activity, with Kasey bowling an impressive 34 games over the course of the competition! Throughout the week, Kasey competed in three major events:

Junior Nationals: They bowled nine games and achieved a new personal best, with an average score of 158. Kasey's remarkable results included:

- 1st place in Doubles
- 3 2nd place in Mixed Teams
- 2nd place in Singles (B grade)
- ∘ 🕉 3rd place in All Events (B grade)

Classic Cup: Qualifying in 24th place, Kasey bowled eight games and finished 15th, improving their average to 169—an increase of 11 pins.

President's Shield: Representing South Australia (SA) and Tenpin SA as part of a team of six, Kasey faced a loud and energetic environment. They bowled 17 games, winning seven and scoring over 200 in three games. This challenging experience resulted in an average score of 164.

SASY is incredibly proud of Kasey's achievements and look forward to seeing even more success in the future!




